1. DACA grants recipients work permission and protects them from deportation, but it does not confer citizenship or legal permanent-resident status. They are not granted legal status, according to the Department of Homeland Security, though their removals are deferred.

But, according to immigration data, slightly fewer than 40,000 DACA recipients have obtained “green cards,” or legal permanent residency, and more than 1,000 have become U.S. citizens. This is possible because DACA recipients can change their immigration status through a legal basis other than DACA, such as by marrying an American. (MAIN, A4)
